All students have been to the theatre and have taken part in the career networking event.

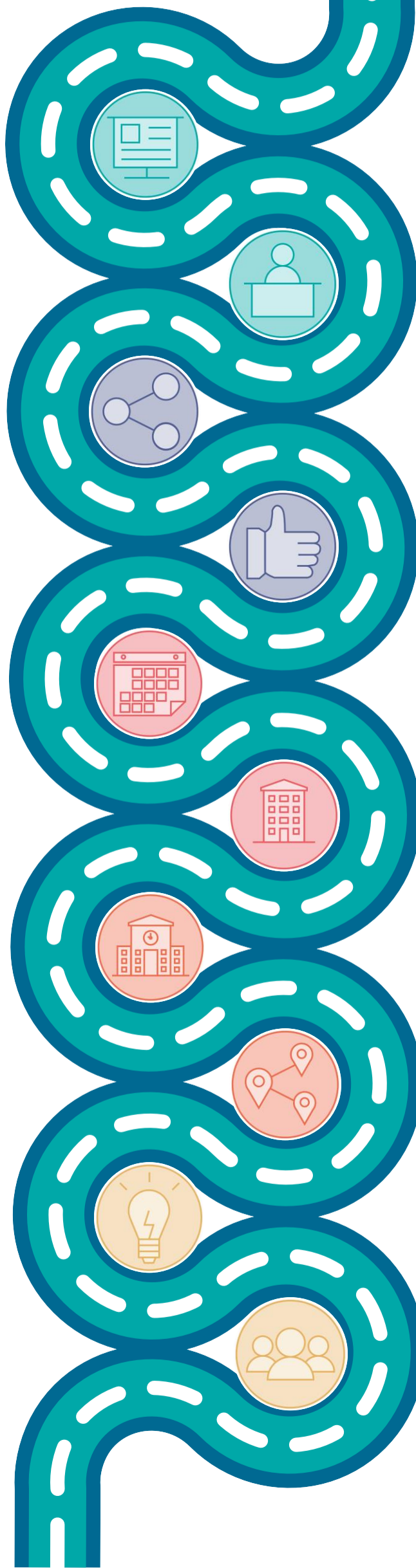
Year 8
